¶The public plan must be self-sustaining. It should pay claims with money raised from premiums and co-payments. It should not receive tax revenue or appropriations from the government. **No problem with this.**

¶The public plan should pay doctors and hospitals more than what Medicare pays. Medicare rates, set by law and regulation, are often lower than what private insurers pay. **Medicare set fees are very appropriate and adequate (please refer to the clinic section dealing with this in my book listed in the Independent Reviewer)**

¶¶The government should not compel doctors and hospitals to participate in a public plan just because they participate in Medicare. ***This nullifies any help a government plan might offer and alluded to in the last presidential campaign. Medicare for All is just what Sen. Baucus was encouraging last fall.***

¶¶To prevent the government from serving as both "player and umpire," the officials who manage a public plan should be different from those who regulate the insurance market. ***If the plan being offered is Medicare that is exactly what should be offered not some do nothing effort that leaves us worse off than before.***
